WORKERS' COMPENSATION EXPOSURE INCIDENT REPORTING

Exposure incident forms are used to voluntarily report an unexpected workplace incident exposure from:

- leaks,
- spills,
- ruptures,
- unanticipated emissions,
- explosions,
- release of dangerous chemicals or physical substances,
- contact with infectious substances or biological agents.

The purpose of these forms is:

- to obtain information about the exposure incident experienced by the worker should an illness or disease occur in the future, and
- to help the WSIB gather information about the exposure incident so they can process a claim if worker(s) experience an illness or disease in the future.

Remember!

- Exposure forms should only be submitted for an unexpected workplace exposure event with no lost time and no illness.
- The forms are used to report (or bookmark) an exposure in the event the worker experiences illness or disease in the future.
- If the worker is experiencing an illness and needs medical treatment, (e.g., diagnostic tests, prescribed medication or ongoing treatment) as a result of the incident, they should file a Report of Injury/Disease. (Form 6)
